**COURTROOM AND BUILDING RULES**

- \* No one will be permitted to enter the courtroom after the proceedings have begun.
- \* Anyone leaving the courtroom while the hearing is in progress will be readmitted only during a court break.
- \* Except for those belonging to certain court personnel and those persons who have requested and received permission to cover the proceedings in accordance with the Media Coverage Plan, all cameras, recording devices, laptops, tablets, and cell phones must be turned off during the proceedings.
- \* No weapons of any kind, including pocket knives, will be permitted in the building.
- \* Excessive talking, noise, or disruption will not be tolerated in the courtroom. Those engaging in such behavior will be removed from the courtroom.
- \* No food, gum, or beverages of any kind are permitted.
- \* No backpacks or bags are permitted in the building.
- \* An appropriate dress code for the courtroom will be enforced. Business or casual business dress attire is preferred. T-shirts or shorts will not be allowed.
- \* No signs or placards of any kind will be allowed in the building.



ORDER

This Court, by order dated June 28, 2016, adopted, with slight modifications noted in that order, the Media Coverage Plan of the Alabama Supreme Court as the Media Coverage Plan ("the Media Coverage Plan") for this Court. In addition to the requirements of the Media Coverage Plan, this Court hereby ORDERS the following for any hearings in this matter:

- (1) No "live feeds," "live broadcasting," or "social media" updates of the proceedings from inside the courtroom are permitted;
- (2) Except for those belonging to certain court personnel and those persons who have requested and received permission to cover the proceedings in accordance with the Media Coverage Plan, all cameras, recording devices, laptops, tablets, and cell phones must be turned off during the proceedings.

Any person violating this order may be ordered to leave the courtroom.
