

DANIEL THOMPSON MCCALL, JR.
Associate Justice - 1969-1975

BORN: March 12, 1909; Butler, Alabama

Daniel Thompson McCall, Jr., resides in Mobile. He holds a bachelor of arts degree, 1931, a law degree, 1933, and an honorary L.L.D. degree, 1981, from the University of Alabama. He practiced law in Mobile until 1960. During World War II he served in the United States Navy.

In 1950, Justice McCall was elected to the Mobile County School Board and served for eight years. He was a founder of the Julius T. Wright School for Girls. He is a former president of the Mobile Bar Association and member of the State Board of Bar Commissioners. From 1965 to 1979 he was a trustee of the University of Alabama and now serves on the Board's Committee on University Hospitals.

Justice McCall was elected circuit judge of Mobile County in 1960 and again in 1964 and 1968. The United States Supreme Court admitted him in 1960. In 1969, Governor Albert P. Brewer appointed him to the Alabama Supreme Court, and he was elected to the Court in 1970. In 1975, at the end of his term, he retired.

Among Justice McCall's many awards are the M. O. Beal Scroll of Merit, the University of Alabama Law School Dean's Award, the Cumberland Law School Order of Jurisprudence, and selection to ***Who's Who in American Law***. In 1981 he was named to the Alabama Academy of Honor.

In 1937, Mary Montgomery of Anniston and Daniel Thompson McCall, Jr., were married. They have three children and seven grandchildren.
