

**JOHN HENRY ENGLAND, Jr.**  
**Associate Justice - 1999-2001**  
*BORN: June 5, 1947 - Uniontown, Alabama*

John H. England, Jr., the son of Willie Ann England and the late John Henry England, Sr., attended public schools in Birmingham, Alabama. He graduated from Tuskegee Institute with a B.A. in Chemistry in 1969, and served as a Military Policeman in the U.S. Army from 1970 to 1972. He graduated from the University of Alabama Law School in 1974, and practiced law in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, until June 1993, when he was appointed to the Tuscaloosa County Circuit Court bench, and elected to a full term in 1994. He was appointed to serve as an Associate Justice on the Alabama Supreme Court by Gov. Jim Folsom, Jr., in 1999. He currently serves as a Circuit Court Judge for the Sixth Judicial Circuit.

Justice England is active in numerous civic and professional organizations, having served on the Democratic Executive Committee and as Past President of the Alabama New South Coalition. He served two terms on the Tuscaloosa City Council, and served on the Board of Trustees for the University of Alabama. He also held leadership positions in numerous civic, professional, social, and political organizations on the local and state levels.

Justice England is a member of Bailey Tabernacle Church, where he serves as a Trustee, a Sunday School teacher, and a member of the male chorus. He is the father of John H. England, III, an attorney with the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Northern District of Alabama; April England Albright, an attorney in Atlanta, Georgia; and Christopher J. England, an attorney in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and a member of the Alabama House of Representatives.
