Associate Justice - 1997-

Harold Frend See, Jr., son of Harold F. See, Sr., and Corinne See, received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Emporia State University, Kansas, his Master of Science degree in economics from Iowa State University, and his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Iowa College of Law, where he graduated with honors and was awarded the Order of the Coif.

Justice See has worked as a heavy equipment operator, a sheet metal worker, and a roofer. He served as Assistant Professor of Economics at Illinois State University, and was in the private practice of law prior to joining the faculty of the University of Alabama School of Law, where he served for more than twenty years as Associate Professor, Full Professor, and as the Herbert D. Warner Professor of Law.

A contributing editor to the Federal Circuit Bar Journal, Justice See is a member of the American Law Institute, the Alabama Law Institute, the American Law and Economics Association, the Federalist Society, the American Bar Association, the Alabama State Bar, and V.O.C.A.L. He served as reporter for the Alabama Trade Secrets acts, the revisions to the Alabama trademark law, and the suggested revisions to Alabama's arbitration law.

Justice See was elected to serve as an Associate Justice on the Alabama Supreme Court in 1996, and began serving in that position in 1997.

Justice See, a member and deacon of the Calvary Baptist Church in Tuscaloosa, is married to the former Brenda Childs of Tuscaloosa. He has four children: Mary Elisabeth, Eric, Suzanne, and Garrett.
