The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON — Only a few leaders know how desperately Senator McCarthy scraped the political barrel for ammunition to use against Stevenson last Monday night.

The Wisconsin senator got most of his help from the old America First members who tried to keep this country out of war with Germany. Ex-America First Chief Robert Wood turned him loose in the old America First secret files, also raised the money for his broadcast.

McCarthy, in turn, submitted the first draft of his speech to the America First group. However, he worked on it again after receiving it back. The only outfit that got an advance copy of the finished speech was the radio station in the press.

As an example of how thorough McCarthy's dirt-digging expedition was, one investigator even went through back copies of the Bloomington Pantagraph, one-quarter owned by Stevenson, to see whether Adlai had written anything damaging under his by-line as a young reporter. The search yielded nothing.

Some Democratic politicians are having to eat some words in this campaign they would like to forget, or rub out of public mind and print altogether.

Sen. John Sparkman (July 4, 1948): "We believe that you, Gen. Eisenhower, more than any other American, are especially equipped to give us the leadership this nation and these times demand."

## The Four Amendments

In the excitement over voting in the presidential contest Tuesday, do not forget there are four state amendments also on the ballot.

Two of them are local, and apply to Blount and Fayette counties. They ask permission to issue bonds for the encouragement of industry.

No. 1 amendment, however, is statewide in effect, and affects every person who drives an automobile, or other motor vehicle. It is better known as the "Road Protection Fund Amendment."

Its purpose is to prevent diversion of some \$2,500,000 annually in gas taxes from the state Highway department for city and county usage.

Some 41 farm, labor and industry groups, including the Alabama Farm Bureau Federation and the Alabama Federation of Labor, as well as several Chamber of Commerce, have approved it.

Unless state road tax funds are used only for road purposes, as Amendment No. 1 provides, it will be almost impossible to get a real, long-range improvement program started on our major state and federal highways.

Amendment No. 2 provides for lengthening the terms of county sheriffs from four to six years. The amendment would have better chance of passage if it provided for reduction in the terms from four to two years, instead of increasing them to six years.
