The Court of Civil Appeals, composed of a presiding judge and four associate judges, was created by the Alabama Legislature in 1969. The Court has original appellate jurisdiction in all civil appeals where the amount involved does not exceed \$50,000; in all appeals from administrative agencies, other than the Alabama Public Service Commission; in all appeals in workers' compensation cases; in all appeals in domestic relation cases, including annulment, divorce, adoption, and child custody; and in statutory cases, including Students First Act and SHPDA, among others. The Supreme Court may also transfer cases filed in that court to the Court of Civil Appeals for disposition. All decisions of the Court are made en banc. Each judge is required to review each case submitted to the Court.

For FY 2025, the Court of Civil Appeals reported a total caseload of 1,661 cases. This figure includes 1,097 new filings and 564 cases that, at the close of the previous term, were not ready for submission, were on rehearing, or were on review to the Supreme Court of Alabama. The Court of Civil Appeals disposed of 1,060 cases. Of these cases: 207 were decided with opinion; 450 were affirmed without opinion; 71 were reversed and remanded; 74 were either dismissed or writs were granted or denied; and 326 were disposed before submission. Of the 734 cases disposed by opinion, summary affirmance, and other reasons, the Court affirmed the judgment in 67% of cases; reversed the judgment in 10% of cases; affirmed in part and reversed in part in 5% of cases; and disposed by dismissal or other reason in 18% of cases.

APPLICATIONS FOR REHEARING

An application for rehearing is the method by which one, or both, of the parties requests the court to reconsider its earlier decision in a case. Of the cases that were disposed by submission and decision, 109 applications for rehearing were filed. Approximately 93% of the cases on rehearing had no change.
