JUDICIAL INQUIRY COMMISSION'S OBJECTION TO
JUDGE JINKS'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

COMES NOW, the Judicial Inquiry Commission (hereinafter "the Commission") and hereby objects to Probate Judge John Randall "Randy" Jinks's (hereinafter "Judge Jinks") motion for extension of time to file a responsive pleading to the Complaint; requests that this Honorable Court deem Judge Jinks's failure to file a responsive pleading as an admission of the factual allegations that form the basis of the charges against him; and further requests that this Court fix a date for hearing upon the Complaint as expeditiously as possible. In support, the Commission states as follows:

1. Rule 5 of the Rules of Procedure for the Alabama Court of the Judiciary, titled "**Filing Responsive Pleadings**," states that "[a]ny such pleadings shall be filed in the office of the secretary in Montgomery by the judge not more than 30 days following the service of the notice and the copy of the complaint upon him or her." It continues, "For good cause

shown, the Court may extend the time for filing such pleadings.” Rule 5, Ala. R. P. Ct. Jud.

2. Rule 5 further states, “The failure of the judge to file a responsive pleading may be considered as an admission of the factual allegations that form the basis of the charge or charges.” Id.

3. The Alabama Supreme Court recognized the compelling need for expediency in adjudicating a pending complaint in this Court in its Rule 8, Ala. R. P. Ct. Jud., which states, “The Court shall fix a date for hearing upon the complaint as expeditiously as possible,” and Rule 7, which provides, “Dilatory motions will be treated with disfavor. Any action which, in the opinion of the Court, would interfere with the prompt disposition of the proceedings pending before the Court shall be discouraged.”

4. Under the circumstances presented herein, Judge Jinks has failed to present any compelling reason to overcome the explicit priority of expedient disposition so that he can file an untimely responsive pleading. Thus, his failure to file a responsive pleading should be considered as an admission of the factual allegations that form the basis of the charges against him.

5. From October 28, 2020 until March 23, 2021, Judge Jinks was represented by two attorneys.

6. During their representation, Judge Jinks filed with the Commission a 24-page response to the Commission's investigation (filed November 12, 2020).

7. The Commission filed the Complaint against Judge Jinks in this Court on March 4, 2021.

8. On Tuesday, March 23, 2021, the two counsel who had been representing Judge Jinks notified the Commission and the Clerk of Court, that by mutual agreement their firm would no longer be representing Judge Jinks.

9. On Monday, March 29, 2021, Judge Jinks informed the Commission, via email, that he "anticipated meeting with an attorney later this week. They are currently out of the country on vacation."

10. Judge Jinks's responsive pleading was due to be filed in this Court on or by Monday, April 5, 2021.

11. On April 8, 2021, new counsel for Judge Jinks filed a notice of appearance, and Judge Jinks filed a motion for extension of time. In

that motion, Judge Jinks asserts that his newly hired counsel needs time to respond to the 78-page Complaint.

12. Since the time that Judge Jinks was no longer represented by former counsel, Judge Jinks had more than 13 days to retain counsel and file a responsive pleading.

13. Judge Jinks does not need more time to file a responsive pleading because his 24-page response to the Commission's investigation specifically, thoroughly, and factually responds to the vast majority of the allegations in the Complaint. See Complaint, "C. Judge Jinks's Response: Denial, Excuse, and Shifting Blame," pp. 40-47. That response clearly relies heavily on his personal representations. If he were to deviate from or refute those representations in any responsive pleading filed with this Court, he would expose himself to additional charges against him, i.e., based on either numerous misrepresentations to the Commission in his November 12, 2020 response or to this Court, if he is allowed to file an untimely responsive pleading.

14. Further, Rule 5, Ala. R. P. Ct. Jud., allows for a mere "general denial of all the averments in the complaint" to suffice as a responsive pleading. Accordingly, new counsel could have filed a general

denial to the few averments Judge Jinks did not address in his November 12, 2020 response.

15. The Commission also bases its requests on the distress and embarrassment of the primary witnesses for the Commission, i.e., court employees or former employees who have diligently served the probate court. They had no choice being victims and/or witnesses to Judge Jinks's grossly inappropriate demeanor.¹ As a consequence of his alleged inappropriate conduct, they endured a difficult, unprofessional, and inappropriate atmosphere during the ordinary workday in that office. Now, because of their duty to cooperate with the Commission's investigation and prosecution—again, without a choice—they have been subject to personal attacks on social media by Judge Jinks and others; by

¹ As alleged in the Complaint, such inappropriate demeanor includes making racist and racially insensitive slurs and comments about African Americans; making sexual and/or inappropriate comments about the appearance and anatomy of females; making sexual and/or inappropriate comments to employees, e.g., about sexual activity; watching and sharing with employees a video of women doing a striptease, a video of a scantily clad woman provocatively dancing, and/or a provocative photograph or image; looking at women inappropriately; sharing sexually inappropriate anecdotes; making degrading, ridiculing comments to or about women, including the female employees; cursing and playing a video with cursing; and generally using crude, coarse, vulgar, offensive and improper language.

Judge Jinks on a local morning talk show; and in their communities. These personal attacks will continue until this Court disposes of the Complaint against Judge Jinks.

16. On March 13, 2021, Judge Jinks took to Facebook to address, in multiple paragraphs, the Complaint and its allegations and to also encourage people to watch him on his then-upcoming appearance on “Daybreak Live,” hosted by Mr. Jimmy Dale Abrams. See Ex. 1, Judge Jinks’s March 12, 2021 Facebook Post. For examples of others’ Facebook posts, see Ex. 2.

17. On March 18, 2021, Judge Jinks appeared on the local television show, “Daybreak Live,” on WOIL & WOTM, available on YouTube at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KNPYUonwOC0>. Judge Jinks appeared on “Daybreak Live” for 28 minutes, specifically addressing and answering questions about the allegations in the Complaint. See Ex. 3, Transcript Daybreak Appearance (March 18, 2021).

18. On March 29, 2021, Judge Jinks visited an employee in the Sylacauga Probate Court Office, contrary to the Commission's explicit instruction in a letter dated March 4, 2020.²

19. In addition, particularly given that the Commission's charges include that Judge Jinks has exhibited grossly inappropriate demeanor, said behavior as alleged in the Complaint has injured respect for the judiciary, and further the public's confidence in the judicial system has been gravely eroded. The public's interest in an expedited resolution of disciplinary proceedings against Judge Jinks advances the goal of

² Article VI, sec. 159, Ala. Const. 1901, provides, "A judge shall be disqualified from acting as a judge, without loss of salary, while there is pending . . . a complaint against him filed by the judicial inquiry commission with the court of the judiciary."

To dispel any ambiguity in the application of the constitutional prohibition of "acting as a judge," the Commission advised Judge Jinks in a letter dated March 4, 2021, that while a Complaint is pending in the Court of the Judiciary, he is prohibited from entering any courthouse or court offices in the jurisdiction where he holds office or from initiating any communication with the staff of any courthouse in that jurisdiction. The Commission further advised that the only exception to this prohibition is when he has a personal matter pending in any of those courts, and then his contact should be only to the extent that any other member of the public would have access to the court or the court staff. (The Commission also stated that this does not prohibit his counsel from contacting court employees in preparing a defense against the Complaint.)

restoring and maintaining the public's confidence and trust in this State's judiciary.

20. A 21-day delay, as requested by Judge Jinks, without good cause shown would only interfere with the prompt disposition of these proceedings, as it would ultimately postpone the trial of this matter at the expense of the public, the judiciary in general, the other judges covering his judicial duties, and the Commission's witnesses who should not have to endure continued distress and embarrassment.

WHEREFORE, premises considered, the Commission respectfully requests that this Honorable Court deny Judge Jinks's motion for extension of time to file a responsive pleading to the Complaint; deem his failure to timely file a responsive pleading as an admission of the factual allegations that form the basis of the charges against him; and fix a date for this Court to hear the Complaint as expeditiously as possible.

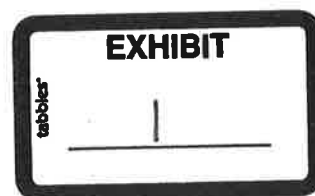

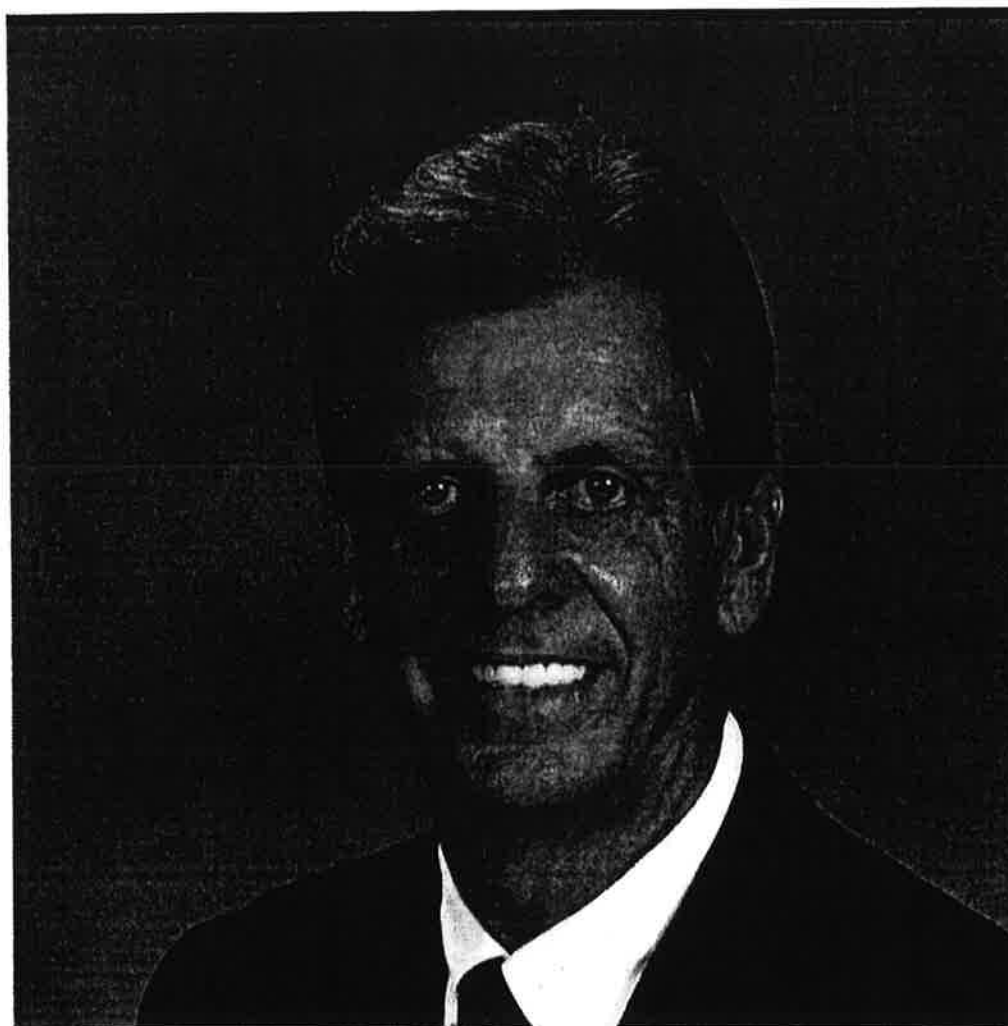

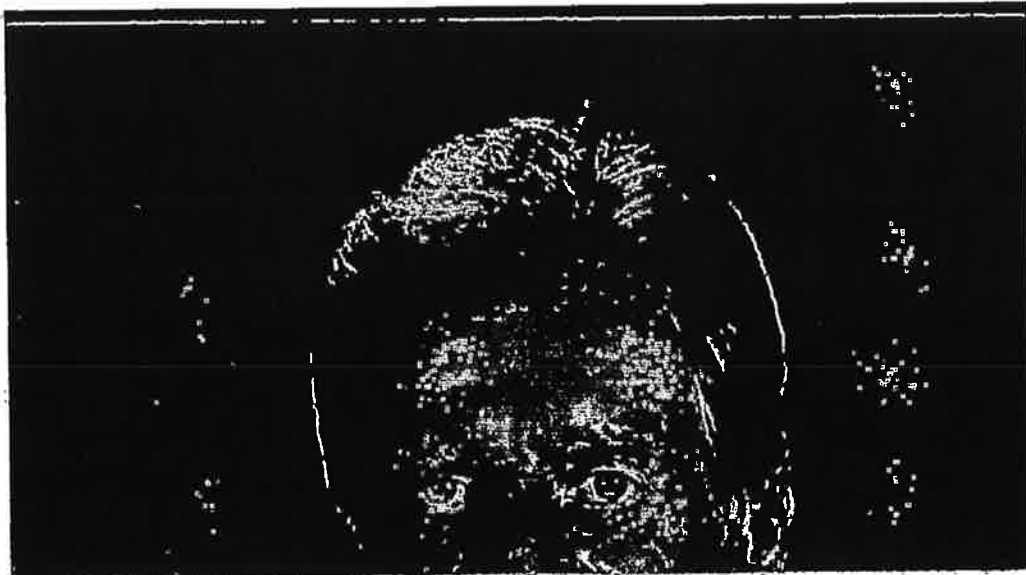

TRANSCRIPTION of a YouTube video
bearing a post date of March 18, 2021,
transcribed from the YouTube website was taken
before Emily C. Pearce, Certified Court Reporter,
Commissioner for the State of Alabama, on
Wednesday, March 24, 2021.

* * * * *

1 (YouTube video transcription as follows:)

2 THE REPORTER: It is a minute now
3 after the hour. You're watching Daybreak live on
4 WOTM and WOIL television. Talladega County
5 Probate Judge Randy Jinks has been suspended after
6 a 78-page complaint was sent to the Alabama Court
7 of Judiciary. The complaint alleges numerous
8 instances of Jinks being -- behaving
9 unprofessionally and in violation of the cannons
10 of judicial ethics, including inappropriate
11 comments of a racist and sexist nature. A lengthy
12 and sometime profane tirade regarding a sandwich
13 and others, including providing county owned
14 equipment to a convicted felon that Jinks had
15 living on his property.

16 Now, Randy Jinks is here this
17 morning, and, Randy, good morning to you.

18 MR. JINKS: Good morning.

19 THE REPORTER: I'm glad you're safe
20 from the storms this morning.

21 MR JINKS: Well, I'm glad you are
22 too, and it's always good to be with you.
23 Appreciate -- appreciate the opportunity.

1 THE REPORTER: Randy, in his first
2 full sit-down interview since the charges were let
3 several weeks ago.

4 Randy, what do you say to all this?

5 MR. JINKS: Well, first, I want
6 everybody to know that I'm the same Randy that you
7 voted for and supported two years ago. I haven't
8 changed. I am a decent person. I am very
9 respectful around women. I do not use racial
10 slurs. I do not go off on tirades in office. I
11 do get mad if somebody steals my food, but I am at
12 peace. I am content.

13 This has probably been one of the
14 most rewarding experiences of my life because it's
15 moved me closer to the Lord. I have prayed a lot
16 about this, and it really shook me when it first
17 happened. You could've blew me over with a
18 feather. But I have got people praying for me all
19 over the state, perhaps all over the country. And
20 I have prayed continuously, but I've prayed for
21 protection because I knew I was innocent of these
22 charges. I'm not saying that I haven't made a few
23 errors along the way, but the overwhelming

1 majority of these very vicious and vile and vulgar
2 accusations are false. So I've prayed for
3 protection. God's given me that protection. I'm
4 content. I have nothing to fear.

5 People can say what Thai want, Jimmy
6 Dale, but these people cannot hurt me because I'm
7 being protected by God Almighty. And I pray for
8 them. Because anybody that would unleash such a
9 vicious character assignation must be a miserable
10 person right now.

11 I want to make note of two things.
12 Not a single person -- there's not been a person
13 withstanding with any issue before the court that
14 has filed a complaint. There is not been a person
15 -- an aggrieved party of any case that has filed a
16 complaint. This is an internal attempted coup by
17 some people that for some reason didn't like me,
18 didn't like the way I come in. I come into
19 office, I took a year I thought to get acclimated
20 to the job. I didn't want to come in and make any
21 hasty decisions and make any -- I wanted to be
22 precise in what I did and get a good feeling and
23 get acclimated to the job before I started really

1 exercising any kind of judicial authority, but
2 after a year, I felt comfortable. I made some
3 decisions. My chief clerk -- one decision was
4 regarding these adoptions, and she was just
5 adamantly opposed to it. She had a personal
6 conflict with the -- with the attorney. She just
7 did not like him as an individual, and I think
8 that's what initiated this. This is -- this is
9 something that's been worked on probably ten
10 months. It's something that has been compiled,
11 but these are lies, half truths, innuendos, and
12 people that have sat outside my office without my
13 knowledge of knowing they were there and have
14 listened to personal, private conversations that I
15 have with individuals about personal and private
16 matters and they've taken these comments and they
17 have misconstrued them, switched them, and made
18 them sound ugly and vile, and that's just the
19 truth.

20 I think everybody that knows me
21 knows that this is not me. I have got just an
22 enormous amount of support from people that have
23 said we'll stand with you. We know this is a lie.

1 We've know you all your life, and we know this is
2 not the person you are.

3 Jimmy, I have been reading a lot of
4 books, in addition to reading my Bible a lot, and
5 I had a friend of mine give me this book called
6 Prison to Praise. And this little book is not
7 about prison with bars. It's about a prison of
8 circumstances and how to be set free. It's --
9 it's a book that tells you, you should be thankful
10 for all things. When I first read all this, it
11 was sort of hard for me to grasp the idea that I
12 could be thankful for what I'm going through. But
13 after I read this book, I've come to realize that
14 regardless what happens, I'm better. I'm better
15 off coming out of this as a man than I was going
16 in, and I'm going to be fine. I'm going to be
17 fine.

18 THE REPORTER: Let's -- Randy, let's
19 talk about --

20 MR. JINKS: I brought you this book.
21 This is for you.

22 THE REPORTER: Okay. Thank you.
23 Let's talk about some of the

1 accusations in this 78-page complaint sent by the
2 Alabama Court of Judiciary. Randy has said to me,
3 You can ask me anything that you want to ask me,
4 and I am going by these complaints. One of the
5 things that stands out in my mind is --

6 MR. JINKS: You can ask me what you
7 want to ask me. I want everybody to know, I am
8 here against the advice of my attorney. My
9 attorney didn't want me to talk to anybody. But
10 as I told you yesterday, my good name and
11 character is a priority here, more so than the
12 job. That's what I'm fighting for is my good name
13 and character. So I may not be able to answer you
14 completely, but you're welcome to ask me anything
15 you want to.

16 THE REPORTER: The heart of the
17 complaint seems to be the allegation that Judge
18 Jinks, by his numerous actions or comments
19 collectively referred to as demeanor, in the
20 probate court office are the -- in the execution
21 of duties of the probate judge in his official
22 capacity, has exhibited grossly inappropriate
23 demeanor that has created a difficult,

1 unprofessional, and inappropriate atmosphere
2 during the ordinary workday in that office and has
3 injured the judiciary.

4 How do you answer that?

5 MR. JINKS: Well, first of all, let
6 me say that my chief clerk is the supervisor of
7 the office. She manages the office. That person
8 manages the office. They supervise all the
9 employees. I'm probably not in the office --
10 90 percent of the day I'm in my office processing
11 files and doing my job. My primary work is with
12 judicial matters. It's hearings regarding the
13 probating of wills, the issuance of letters of
14 administration, letters of testamentary,
15 guardianships, conservatorships, adoptions, mental
16 health commitments. Those are the things that
17 dominate my time. I'm not in the office enough to
18 actually affect the atmosphere of the office.

19 Now, as far as demeanor, I would --
20 I would wager that anybody that has been in my
21 court for an adoption, for a mental health
22 commitment, or any matter, would tell you that I
23 am a very compassionate person. I have a genuine

1 concern for people. I know that the good Lord
2 placed me here, and I know he placed me here for a
3 reason. And my reason for being here was not to
4 sit in the office and let these people bring a
5 paper in and me sign it and get another paper and
6 sign it. My job was to sit there, process files,
7 learn the job, and when I put my name on the
8 signature, I wanted to make sure that I had
9 reviewed it. It's a -- it's a practice of a lot
10 of judges to delegate authority to a chief clerk,
11 and I think that may have been the practice in the
12 past. But when I come in and I told my chief
13 clerk I will be processing petitions here because
14 I can't learn the job unless I do, I really felt
15 like I was taking a workload off of this person.
16 Because this person had an extreme amount of
17 authority in this office and a heavy workload. So
18 I felt like I was doing this person a favor. But
19 as it looks like now, there was a resentment that
20 began to grown because I was -- in exercising my
21 authority, I was pulling away the authority that
22 this person had, had previously.

23 Now, when it comes to making

1 appointments, like when a power company needs to
2 come to the court with a condemnation hearing,
3 they have imminent domain when they're running
4 power lines, and they -- they need an easement, we
5 have to have a hearing, and I have to appoint a
6 three-member commission. And I told this person
7 that I would be making those appointments. I sat
8 in on interviews when we hired people. I think
9 that may be something that they weren't accustomed
10 to. So it's not like I've come in and tried to
11 run the office heavy handedly. I took my time to
12 gradually get acclimated to this office, but I
13 know I was put there for a reason, Jimmy Dale, and
14 if I didn't -- if I didn't accomplish what the
15 good Lord put me there to accomplish, then I have
16 wasted an opportunity.

17 THE REPORTER: The complaint accuses
18 you of making racist and racially insensitive
19 slurs and comments about African Americans, making
20 sexual and/or inappropriate comments to employees
21 about sexual activities, watching and sharing with
22 employees a video of women doing strip tease, a
23 video of a -- (indecipherable) -- woman

1 provocatively dancing and/or provocative
2 photograph or images looking at women
3 inappropriately, sharing sexually inappropriate
4 anecdotes, making degrading, ridiculing comments
5 to or about women, including the female employees,
6 and cursing and playing a video with cursing and
7 generally using crude, coarse, vulgar, offensive,
8 and inappropriate -- and improper language. The
9 incident of inappropriate demeanor charge in this
10 complaint are not isolated incidences. They are
11 representative of ongoing pattern and practice of
12 inappropriate demeanor. Those are strong charges,
13 Randy.

14 MR. JINKS: They are.

15 How long have you known me, Jimmy
16 Dale?

17 THE REPORTER: A long time.

18 MR. JINKS: Okay. Have you ever
19 seen me conduct myself in any manner similar to
20 what you've just read on that paper?

21 THE REPORTER: This is not a
22 question and answer between you and I, but I would
23 answer that as I have not.

1 MR. JINKS: Okay. Those fall --
2 there's some stuff in there that is true, but my
3 demeanor is not what they say it is. I'm -- I'm
4 respectful around the women. I've never made any
5 kind of inappropriate comment to any of the women
6 in the office. I have never used a racial slur.
7 I don't use the "N" word. That's not me. Anybody
8 that knows me knows -- some of my closest friends
9 know that that's not the case.

10 Now, as far as the video, I have one
11 male employee in my office, and he and I were in
12 the basement working on poll books one day, just
13 the two of us, and I received a little video --
14 music video and I shared it with him, and I
15 admitted to everyone that it was an error in my
16 judgment at that time. But it was two guys in --
17 at that point in time when it come through. I
18 said -- (indecipherable) -- would you just look at
19 this. He wasn't offended by it, but needless to
20 say, I admitted that that was an error in my
21 judgment.

22 Now, I got a video of a woman
23 dancing with a vacuum cleaner. It was about a 15

1 second -- yeah, a friend of mine sent it to me.
2 It's one of these things that's on YouTube. I
3 could show it to you on YouTube right now. It's
4 about a 20 second video. I played it. I replayed
5 it the second time and then the accuser come
6 walking into my office, and I noticed the accuser
7 come walking in at a faster rate than they
8 normally walk into my office. It was almost as if
9 they knew what I was -- it's almost like they
10 recognized the music. They come in and they said,
11 What are you listening to? And I said, This
12 (indicating) little video, and I turned it toward
13 her for about three seconds, and that's the way
14 that went. I never said, Hey, come here. I got
15 something I want to show you. Never. That never
16 happened. It was not -- it's all been described
17 in a way to shed a bad light on me. It's just
18 another illustration of how these people have
19 taken an incident and they've twisted it to make
20 it look vile and ugly because that's the way they
21 want people to view me. But that's -- that's the
22 facts about that. But I'm very respectful. I've
23 never told a women in my office that I like to

1 look at her breasts. I do not look at the women
2 in that light. I don't gawk at the women. If I
3 look at a women's chest, it's cause she's got a
4 T-shirt with something written across the front of
5 it, and if she don't want anybody to read it, then
6 she wouldn't wear a T-shirt. But these are --
7 this is just a good example of how they've taken,
8 you know, situations and twisted -- and in many
9 instances, taken my words and used them against
10 me.

11 THE REPORTER: There were several
12 other racial accusations that supposedly had come
13 from you. Could you address those this morning?

14 MR. JINKS: Yeah. I'll be glad to.
15 I had an incident --- actually, I had a hearing,
16 and the attorney who's name was mentioned -- it's
17 unfortunate that his name come up because he's a
18 very fine individual. I've been knowing him for
19 years, and he's a good attorney. And I felt like
20 that they could have -- they could have filed a
21 complaint and not had to use his name. But this
22 attorney had come in, it's at the middle --
23 probably the middle of last year when our country

1 is literally being torn apart with all the rioting
2 and the looting, all the racial division, you
3 know, people's buildings and businesses being
4 destroyed, people being killed, everything is a
5 racial slur. Aunt Jemima can't be on the maple
6 syrup no more. Uncle Ben's Rice no longer exists.
7 Dixie Chicks have to drop the word "Dixie". I
8 mean, it's just -- it's canceled culture at its
9 worst.

10 So we had a hearing, and the way I
11 recall it when the hearing was over, we had a
12 discussion about what is going on in our country
13 today. And I said, you know, everything is a
14 racial slur. And I said, you know, I'm happy to
15 say that I don't -- I don't know many racial
16 slurs, and I'm glad I don't. And I told him, I
17 said one of the few that I know was shared with me
18 when I worked at a car automobile dealership years
19 ago, and it had something to do with the word
20 "Pontiac".

21 Now, Jimmy Dale, if I share a racial
22 slur with you that I've learned, that's not using
23 a racial slur. That's just letting you know that

1 I have become aware of something that I didn't
2 know. And there's a lot of this -- yeah, there's
3 a lot of slurs out there that you and I are
4 totally oblivious from because we're not into
5 that. So that explains that situation. That was
6 a conversation where I was sharing with him a
7 racial slur that somebody had shared with me one
8 time, and I was not using -- I don't use racial
9 slurs. I don't use racial slurs. But -- you
10 know, just another incident of how this little
11 group is trying to twist and use words against me,
12 and it's all because of their attempt to remove me
13 from office. And I don't know -- I don't know why
14 the person that initiated this initiated it, but
15 they've caused a lot of pain and a lot of
16 miserable hours for people, and I would garner
17 more so for them than for me because I am
18 protected. I know the truth. I'm going to stand
19 on the truth. I've told you what I've done this
20 morning, and I'll always admit my shortcomings,
21 but I'm not going to admit to something I didn't
22 do. And even in the complaint, you can read the
23 complaint, the way that it's been constructed, I

1 am criticized for denying the accusations. So
2 this whole process to me seems somewhat slanted,
3 but it is the process, and I have to deal with it
4 because it is what it is.

5 THE REPORTER: Can you speak to,
6 Randy, during that racial unrest in our country
7 and a gentleman that was killed by police in
8 Minnesota --

9 MR. JINKS: Mr. Floyd. Yeah, I'll
10 be glad to speak to that. I have told numerous
11 people that I have not even been able to watch the
12 full-length video because it is so disturbing to
13 me. I've been accused of saying that Mr. Floyd
14 deserved to die, and that is a blatant lie. I
15 never said that. I have told numerous people that
16 I've talked to about this incident, that had one
17 officer had the presence of mind to have knock
18 that officer off Mr. Floyd, that there's a
19 possibility that we could have had a coming
20 together in this county instead of all this
21 division. It look -- I've always been told once a
22 person is handcuffed, the altercation is over.
23 That wasn't the case as far as I saw it but the --

1 anybody that would accuse me of saying that
2 anybody deserved to die is just telling a -- a
3 lie.

4 THE REPORTER: In the complaint, the
5 accusers and several of the other individuals who
6 were mentioned in the complaint are known by their
7 initials. It's their initials. Now, talk about
8 Ms. R.T. Who is she? And how did that come to
9 work?

10 MR. JINKS: R.T. is
11 She is a friend of mine. She befriended me when I
12 used to eat at the Huddle House in Harpersville
13 many years ago. I used to go there and eat and I
14 told everybody I eat my breakfast there because
15 they burn my sausage like I like it. My mother
16 always burnt sausage. That's the way I like it.
17 Most people will not burn your sausage --

18 THE REPORTER: So there's no --
19 nothing into burnt sausage, right?

20 MR. JINKS: Well, that's the way I
21 like it. But anyway, this cook cooked my sausage
22 the first time I went there just like I liked it.
23 So I started frequenting this place, and I take a

1 book and I may sit there an hour, hour and a half
2 and enjoy my breakfast. And this waitress
3 sometimes waited on me; sometimes not, but then
4 after I got used to going there, I would sit in
5 her section. She'd wait on me. She knew I was a
6 reader. She knew I always brought a book.

7 So one day she comes in and she
8 says, have you read the book The Shack? And I
9 said, I haven't heard of it. She says if you ever
10 start reading it, you won't put it down. So the
11 next week she brought me the book. So we become
12 friends. She had some pain pill issues because I
13 Googled her, you know, and I found her mugshot and
14 I told her I found her mugshot and she told me
15 what she was in trouble for. Shortly after that
16 two or three months that I was eating there --
17 maybe five or six months -- they brought in a new
18 manager, all the waitresses quit. In two months,
19 the Huddle House was closed, and I lost track of
20 her except on social media. And every now and
21 then she'd check in. She'd tell me, I'm at the
22 Love Lady Center so I knew she was in trouble.
23 Then she -- about four -- about four and a half

1 years ago, she sent me a message and she said,
2 Randy, I'm in trouble. And I said, What's wrong?
3 And she said, I'm seven months' pregnant. I have
4 no job. I have no money. I have no place to
5 live. And I said, You're in a bad way. I said,
6 What are you going to do? She said my mother and
7 I have never had a relationship. We've never
8 gotten along. But I -- I need to come home. So I
9 -- I was going to get her plane ticket home, but
10 she had a dog. I was going to rent a car, and I
11 thought that couldn't turn out right. So I -- I
12 drove her home, straight through to -- Plant City
13 is near Tampa Bay. Her mother give me a guest
14 bedroom. I slept three hours, I left her a note,
15 I left her a few dollars, and I come back home.
16 She had the baby. And a year or so later, maybe a
17 year a half, she -- she sends me a message one
18 day. She said, I'm back. I said, back where?
19 She said, Shelby County. And I knew that was a
20 mistake because that's where all her problems lie.
21 Long story short, she had violated her probation.
22 She got locked up, she got caught with possession,
23 and she got put in jail in October of 2019. And

1 she would send me messages from the jail, and I
2 would put a little money on her card so she could
3 by snacks and stuff. A lot of people do this. I
4 met an attorney -- he said, We go administer to
5 women in the jail all the time. We pray with
6 them, we counsel them, we read the Bible with
7 them, and he said, We put money on their cards so
8 they have a little spending cash. Well, she
9 convinced me that she had nobody else to help her.
10 Nobody. And I -- you know, I knew she didn't have
11 nobody when I took her to Florida or she had done
12 been down there. So I told her -- I said, I'll --
13 she said, When I get out, could you help me? Just
14 take me under your wing and help me get on my
15 feet. I'm ready to get my life straight. And I
16 said, I will. And I even shared with my chief
17 clerk, you know, if there was a part-time job or
18 something and we have had -- we have people,
19 trustees that work at the courthouse, that when
20 they get out, the courthouse -- the county has
21 hired them. So I knew it was something that had
22 been done before. And I told her --- I said I'll
23 help you with some lodging, and I ended up buying

1 an RV, set it next to the house. I had to do some
2 work on it. Didn't have any heat, didn't have any
3 hot water. And then before I had a chance to get
4 it fixed up for her to live in, she got released
5 because of COVID. I mean, just one evening they
6 called me -- now, I had inquired with the DA, but
7 I never made any contact with the judge. So
8 there's no ex-parte communication there as far as
9 I can see. Another attorney that does the same
10 thing, counseling these women, he intervened and
11 filed a petition that ultimately got her released,
12 and I -- I literally got a call -- they said,
13 She's waiting in the waiting room at the jail.
14 She's been released and she's waiting, so I had to
15 go get her. I mean, I had committed to help her.
16 I'm going to stand by my word. I brought her, she
17 stayed in my home for two -- three nights. I took
18 her to a home in Harpersville, where she was going
19 to catch a ride with her daughter's uncle -- is
20 the way she described it -- to go get her
21 belongings and come back, and I haven't seen her
22 since.

23 THE REPORTER: Randy --

1 MR. JINKS: Wait -- keep in mind,
2 we're in the middle of a shutdown. We're in the
3 middle of a stay-at-home order. We're -- the
4 courthouse is closed, and I told her, I said,
5 You've been released at the worst possible time.
6 So we've got to weather through this until I can
7 help you find a job. But there was nothing --
8 there was nothing -- there was no relationship
9 there. There was --

10 THE REPORTER: No sexual, emotional
11 --

12 MR. JINKS: Nothing. Absolutely
13 nothing.

14 She had her bedroom at the other end
15 of the house, and I -- I stayed at my end. I did
16 discover, after she left, that she had went into
17 my medicine cabinet and drank probably, nearly a
18 -- at least a third a bottle of Vick's nighttime
19 NyQuil, and I knew then she wasn't where she
20 needed to be. And then during this pandemic, stay
21 at home, she wanted to travel, go everywhere. I
22 said, Look, you don't respect me, you don't
23 respect the law, you haven't respected the

1 attorney that got you -- that filed the petition,
2 and you don't respect the Judge that let you out.
3 And I said, And now you don't respect that we're
4 in the middle of a stay-at-home pandemic. So
5 you're not ready so just stay where you're at
6 because you're not going to expose me and me
7 expose my family with this pandemic, and I have
8 not seen her since that day. I -- I was going to
9 do what I committed to her that I was going to do.
10 And this is -- this is just one instance of
11 many that I helped --

12 THE REPORTER: We're -- we're short
13 on time, but I do want you to understand that a
14 lot of people watching this will listen to this
15 story and say, well, that is a strange story.

16 MR. JINKS: Well, strange as it may
17 be, it's the truth. It's the truth, and I'm not
18 going to lie about it. It's the honest to God's
19 truth, and if she had of done right, she would
20 have been in that RV and I'd of helped her get a
21 job and some transportation, and maybe she would
22 be in a good place now. But as the attorney told
23 me that counsels women in the jail, he says,

1 90 percent of the time they're going to break your
2 heart because they're not ready, and he said, but
3 don't ever let that stop you, reaching out and
4 trying to help somebody.

5 THE REPORTER: I got to get to,
6 before we go this morning, the incident with the
7 sandwich, and some people may laugh at that --

8 MR. JINKS: I -- I'll tell you about
9 it.

10 THE REPORTER: -- but that's a very
11 serious thing. Go ahead.

12 MR. JINKS: Two instances I had
13 eaten lunch and had enough left to take home and
14 either eat for supper or the next day, and I put
15 them in the refrigerator in the probate office.
16 And in both instances, my food was stolen.

17 So on July the 14th of last year,
18 the runoff date, Ms. , who is a dear
19 friend of mine, her daughter has cancer right now,
20 and I'm involved in some fundraising efforts to
21 try to help her raise some money to go get some
22 cancer treatment. I got a CD I'm going to try to
23 put out in a few days.

1 THE REPORTER: Two minutes.

2 MR. JINKS: Anyway, Ms. come
3 in at -- called me at 3:00 o'clock. I went out,
4 she was soaking wet. She cleans houses for a
5 living. She said, I brought you a barbecue
6 sandwich and I bought some produce that I just
7 bought at the market to share with you, and it was
8 an act of kindness. I'm usually doing stuff like
9 this to every -- rarely does people do this for
10 me, and it really touched me. And I went in the
11 office and I said, This is mine. I'm putting it
12 in the back of the refrigerator. Well, when I
13 went in there the next day to get it, it was gone.
14 And this is the third time it's happened, and I
15 hadn't said anything to anybody, but this is
16 different. This lady performed an act of kindness
17 that touched me deeply, and somebody stole it, and
18 I got mad.

19 THE REPORTER: You lost it a little
20 bit.

21 MR. JINKS: I told them, I said,
22 Somebody stole my damn sandwich.

23 THE REPORTER: Mm-hmm.

1 MR. JINKS: And I said that
2 aggravates the -- out of me.

3 THE REPORTER: Mm-hmm.

4 MR. JINKS: And I went to my office
5 and I went to Jack's and I ate and I come back.
6 And I wrote an e-mail, a letter, and sent it to
7 everybody saying that nobody should have to put
8 their name on a -- on a Styrofoam container with
9 food because you know if you didn't put it in
10 there, it doesn't belong to you. And I said, I'm
11 disappointed, that anybody that has access to our
12 office would steal somebody's food, and it didn't
13 need to happen again to me and it didn't need to
14 happen to anybody else. That's the only time
15 these people have ever seen me mad. But, yeah, I
16 got mad. It was an act of kindness that was
17 stolen from me, and I think you would have got mad
18 too.

19 THE REPORTER: So you -- before we
20 go, you think it's a group of people that's
21 orchestrating this?

22 MR. JINKS: It's a -- it's an inside
23 a group, a coup, it's a group that was already

1 there. They're only two of them left, and it's
2 just an unfortunate situation. I wished it hadn't
3 of happened, but I'm going to be a better person
4 when it's all over with. I'm a better person now,
5 and I would bargain that they are miserable.

6 THE REPORTER: 30 seconds.

7 MR. JINKS: I just want you to know
8 I'm the same Randy I always was. I think I come
9 on a show here right before the election, when Don
10 Steven hosted me. It was the morning of election
11 when I was -- (indecipherable) -- and I told Don
12 that day, he asked me about Randy Jinks, and I
13 told him a little bit about myself. And I told
14 him, I said, Now, I swear sometimes, Don. And in
15 the heat of the moment, if I get mad, I swear
16 sometimes, not bad, but if I get provoked, I will
17 swear. So I got mad in the courthouse that one
18 time, but that's the only time they seen it. And
19 anybody that's been in my courtroom has seen me.
20 They know I care. I get emotional many times
21 because I care about the job. These are lies,
22 innuendos, half truths and I --

23 THE REPORTER: Time to go. Thank

1 you for the book. Thank you for coming this
2 morning. Randy Jinks.

3 MR. JINKS: Thank you.

4 THE REPORTER: Back with more after
5 this.
