MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Comes the Respondent, Judge Randall Jinks, and moves the Court to continue the trial date of this matter from the current setting of August 16, 2021, and shows as follows:

1. It is requested that the current trial date of August 16, 2021, be reserved to hear the Respondent's motions to dismiss. Four depositions have been taken. All four witnesses were represented by counsel who declined to allow the depositions to be published without first being read and signed by the deponents. This afternoon, the undersigned received unofficial transcripts of two of the four deponents, giving thirty days from today for each of those deponents to read and sign (transcripts have not yet been received for the other two deponents). This delay precludes the Respondent's counsel from completing proper motions to dismiss at this time (or preparing for trial).

2. The Judicial Inquiry Commission's attorney has been asked for a list of witnesses being used in this case and recently informed the undersigned that the witnesses would not be disclosed until a scheduling order was entered by the Court. This action by the Judicial Inquiry Commission further delays proper preparation for the filing of motions to dismiss as well as preparation for trial.

3. The Judicial Inquiry Commission gave notice to the Respondent and to this Court that undersigned counsel would be placed on the Commission's witness list, however the Commission has refused to disclose any other witnesses to the Respondent without a scheduling order from this Court. The Judicial Inquiry Commission has not disclosed any material gathered since on or about March 17, 2021.

4. To adequately prepare for trial, the Respondent must depose each and every person the Judicial Inquiry Commission intends to call as a witness.

5. It is believed that a substantial number of the voluminous claims against the Respondent are due to be dismissed, thereby narrowing the issue and significantly reducing the amount of time needed for the case to be presented to the Court en banc.

6. A delay in the date of trial of this matter will not adversely affect the Judicial Inquiry Commission and will work to ensure that the Respondent is afforded adequate due process protections.

WHEREFORE, the Respondent Judge requests that the Court allow the current setting of August 16, 2021, to be used to hear motions to dismiss by the Respondent, and that a later trial date be determined based upon the schedules of the members of the Court, the Respondent's preparation for trial, and the Judicial Inquiry Commission.
