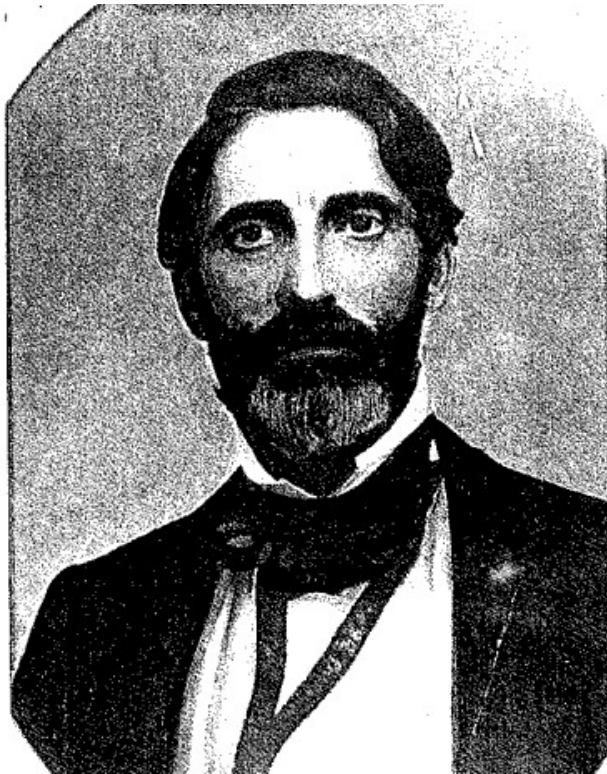


HENRY YOUNG WEBB

Associate Justice: 1820-1823

BORN: August 14, 1784; Grandville County, North Carolina

DIED: September 20, 1823; Greensboro, Alabama

A native of Grandville County, North Carolina, Henry Young Webb was educated at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. He read law and secured his license to practice in Lincolnton. He represented Lincoln county in the legislature in 1817.

In 1818, he settled in Perry County, Alabama. He was appointed Judge of the United States District Court from the territory of Alabama, but soon moved to Greene County, Alabama.

In 1819, he was elected by the first legislature of the state, as a judge of the 3rd Judicial Circuit and the Supreme Court of Alabama. He was one of the original associate justices of the first Alabama Supreme Court, and was holding the distinguished position at the time of his death on his plantation north of Greensboro, in September 1823.

Webb married Elizabeth Forney, and they had five children.
