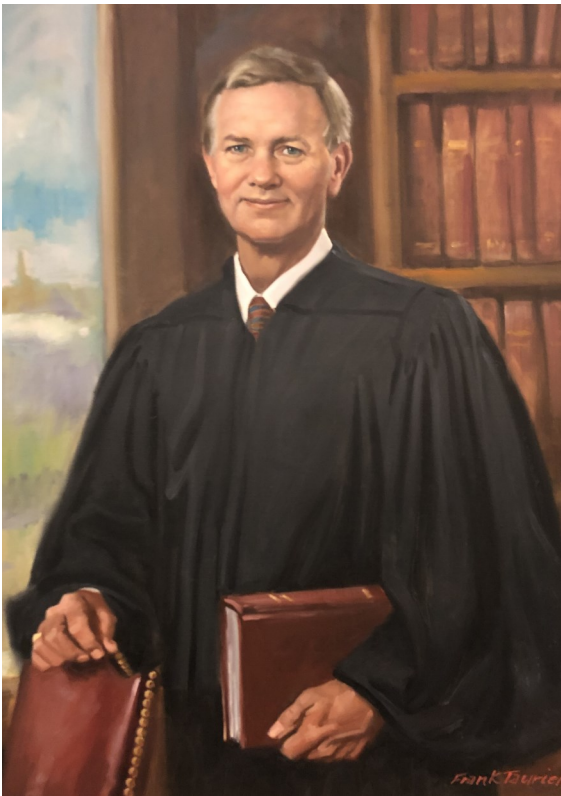

A native of Ashland, Alabama, Kenneth Frank Ingram, graduated from Auburn University in 1956, with a degree in history and English. He attended Faulkner University Thomas Goode Jones School of Law and graduated in 1963 with a J.D. degree. Ingram also served in the United States Marine Corps during the Korean War.

In 1956, Ingram was elected to Ashland City Council. From 1958-1966 he served in the Alabama Legislature. He was then appointed a Circuit Judge for the 18th judicial circuit by Governor Albert Brewer in 1968, and served for eighteen years.

Ingram was a member of the original committee that drafted Alabama's criminal code. In 1986, he was elected to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals. In 1989, he was elected Presiding Judge on the same Court. In 1990, he was elected to the Supreme Court of Alabama as an associate justice.

Ingram married Judy Brown, and they had two children.
