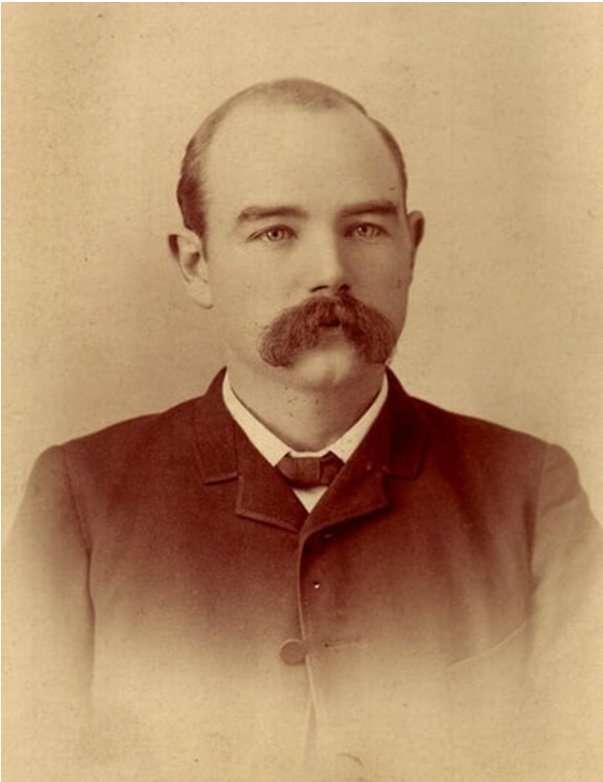


NIMROD DAVIS DENSON

Associate Justice: 1904-1909

BORN: June 20, 1856; Uchee, Alabama

DIED: March 25, 1927; Opelika, Alabama



A native of Uchee, Alabama, Nimrod Davis Denson was the son of Augusts Russell and Elizabeth Ivey Denson. He spent two years at the Agricultural and Mechanical College in Auburn prior to reading law in the office of his brother, William H. Denson. He was admitted to the Alabama State Bar in 1876 and began practice in 1877.

His political career began in 1882 when he became the intendant for the town of Lafayette. He remained in this position until 1884 when he was elected to the State Senate serving from 1884-1887. He was a member of the House of Representatives from 1888-1889. Then, in 1892, he became judge of the fifth judicial circuit in Alabama. He remained in this position until his election to the Supreme Court of Alabama in 1904. Justice Denson only served one term on the Alabama Supreme Court from 1904-1909.

He then resumed the practice of law in Lafayette and later in Opelika. In November of 1924, he was named judge of the fifth judicial circuit.

Denson married Carrie Eugenia Vernon, and they had four children.
